Jeane: Nice to see the photo of N9941F in last August's newsletter. This aircraft along with N9940F were bought from Canadian Pacific Airlines in April 1954, used by TALOA until January 1955 when they were leased to Iran Air. In the first half of 1956 they returned to the US as your father [[Capt. Frank Kennedy](#)] flew both of them on Trans-Pacific operations. Both returned to Iran, not sure when, and in February 1958 were sold to Iran Air. Thus, their operational time with



TALOA was relatively brief, so photos of either are good to see. Thanks, John M Davis, Wichita, KS

And then there's more to the story...

A little more information on the crash that injured Orvis in Cameroon. The accident was on October 11, 1966 – or possibly early the following day. The aircraft was a Canadair DC-4M2 North Star – this was a pressurized and re-engined DC-4 built under license in Canada. The aircraft owner/pilot was H A Wharton, and it was said that the aircraft was operated by Silver Lake Airways, a company for which no record exists. The aircraft left Rotterdam (not Brussels) before refueling in

Italy, with tail marks I-ACOA; a registration not issued by Italian authorities. As well as being lost and out of fuel, the aircraft was 3,000 lbs overweight.

Joseph A. Stachon

Old pilots never die, they just go on to a new plane.

Joe Stachon passed away peacefully at his home in Napa on February 28, 2015 at the age of 97. Joe was a man of many talents: pilot, philosopher, inventor, and proud member of the Greatest Generation.

Joe was born in Chicago in 1917, one of eight children. He spent his childhood in Illinois, Indiana, and Michigan. He attended Valparaiso University and discovered a love of flying which would shape his life.

He was selected for flight training with Pan American in 1941. On December 7, 1941, Pearl Harbor was attacked and the following day Joe enlisted in the



Army Air Corps. He spent WWII flying transport aircraft in Europe, Africa, the Middle East, and Asia.

Following his discharge in 1946, he took a job with a new airline called Transocean. The early days of commercial aviation were not for the faint of heart....every flight was an adventure, and Joe had his share. He flew gold bullion from Siam (Thailand) to Ft. Knox, holocaust survivors from Europe to the United States, British war brides and their children to America, and



vacationers to Hawaii. He always said his time with Transocean was the most interesting of his career. After ten years with Transocean, he went with Japan Air Lines, flying one leg on JAL's inaugural flight. Joe retired from flying after 25 years with JAL.

Joe is survived by daughters Pat Kearns (Bo) of Sonoma, Janet Farmer (Dan) of Los Altos, Kathy Stachon of Mesquite, NV, and son Rick Stachon (Kathy) of Des Moines, Iowa; and

grandchildren Tamsin Kearns, Alex and Austin Farmer, and Zach, Caitlin, and Elizabeth Stachon. His wife Bettie predeceased him in 2003.

In lieu of cards or memorial gifts, Joe's family hopes you will pour a glass of fine Napa Valley wine and toast a life well lived.

The year was 1952, we lived on Galt St, San Lorenzo, near Oakland Airport. Many weekends our family of 4 would go down to the airport and see if there were seats available on the Honolulu flight. Transocean always maintained rooms at the Edgewater Hotel on Waikiki Beach where we loved to go swimming. So spending the weekend in Hawaii was a pretty easy and often occurrence for our family.

1952 was also the year I started Kindergarten. Excited to participate in "show & tell", my hand shot up when Monday morning the teacher asked our class, "What did everyone do this weekend?" I stood up and told everyone that I had gone to Hawaii swimming for the weekend. I remember spending the next hour facing the wall in the corner of the classroom for telling such an obviously outrageous whopper.

Now it just so happened that, while in Hawaii on this weekend in question, I had bought a postcard and mailed it to my teacher. She received it a couple of days later and I remember her apologizing to me.

But now, many years later, the story has an additional meaning to me. I now realize what a fantastic life we had growing up in the TALOA family and getting to experience far-away places that other's couldn't even imagine as being true.
